BILL NO. 94-10

Ordinance No. 940613

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE APPEARANCE AND/OR IMPROPER
CONDUCT OF PERSONS ON PARK PROPERTY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF
WILLARD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to be in
or on park property between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00
a.m., unless specific park activities, authorized and
previously announced by the Willard Park Board, are being
conducted on the premises.

Section 2: It shall be unlawful for any person to
deface, mar, injure, destruct, or otherwise harm any park
property, including any trees, grass, buildings, landscaping,
equipment, tools, or other fixtures or appurtenances located
on park property.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be read in conjunction
with other ordinances of the city of Willard, including
Ordinance No. 7499 and No. 7499A, and shall not be construed
to alter or amend those ordinances.

Section 4: Any person found to be in violation of this
ordinance, and after conviction thereof, shall be subject to
a fine of not less than Twenty-Five and No/100 Dollars
(\$25.00), nor more than Five Hundred and No/100 Dollars
(\$500.00).

Section 5: This ordinance shall be in full force and
effect from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen
and its approval by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 7499A

AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE APPEARANCE AND/OR LOITERING OR LOAFING OF PERSONS AND VAGRANTS WITHIN THE CITY OF WILLARD, MISSOURI; PROHIBITING LOITERING ON CLOSED PARKING LOTS; PROHIBITING LOITERING ON SCHOOL GROUNDS AND BUILDINGS; PROVIDING THE PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATIONS THEREOF; PROVIDING FURTHER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE AND REPEALING PRIOR CONFLICTING ORDINANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF WILLARD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Every person who may be found loitering in or upon any public street, highway, alley, road, park, playground, public ground, public place or public building, place of amusement and entertainment, vacant lot or any other unsupervised place in the City of Willard or wandering from place to place, without any visible means of support, shall be deemed a vagrant.

Section 2. No person, except the owner, tenant or other person in possession or their invitees, shall loiter upon or about any public or private parking lot, nor upon any parking lot provided for the customers, business invitees or employees of any commercial or industrial establishments at any time any such public or private parking lot shall be closed to use by the public or any such commercial or industrial lot shall be closed to use by customers, business invitees and employees. Any such person found loitering upon any such lot or facility at any time that signs have been previously erected giving notice that the lot is closed to use shall be presumptively upon the lot in violation of this section, which presumption shall be rebuttable.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to loiter on the grounds of or within the buildings of any public or private kindergarten, grade or high school when such school is in session and when such school is not in session, and it shall be unlawful for any person so loitering to refuse to leave

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immediately such building or grounds upon request of the principal or other person in charge thereof. This section shall not apply in the case of any particular school to employees, school-approved volunteer aides or students of such particular school.

Section 4. Any person found to be a vagrant as provided in Section 1 hereof and any person violating the provision of Section 2 and 3 shall upon conviction thereof be subject to a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) and not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

Section 5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen and its approval by the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 7499

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE APPEARANCE AND/OR LOITERING OF MINORS WITHIN THE CITY OF WILLARD, MISSOURI.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF WILLARD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of 17 years to be in or upon any public street, highway, alley, road, place of amusement and entertainment, vacant lot or any other unsupervised place in the City between the hours of 11:00 p.m., of any day and 5:00 a.m., of the following day; unless such minor is attending to urgent business and can give a satisfactory reason for being in or upon the places hereinbefore mentioned, or is accompanied by a parent, guardian, adult relative or adult friend approved by a parent or a guardian.

Section 2. When such minor is upon such lawful errands, it shall be deemed a violation of this section for any such minor to loiter or linger, or ride aimlessly upon the street, highway, alley, road or public places in the City, but such minor must transact such business as speedily as possible.

Section 3. Any minor who shall violate the provisions of this section shall, for the first offense, be warned of the violation and sent home. The parent or guardian of such minor shall also be advised of the violation by the Chief of Police or any police officer authorized by the Chief of Police to serve such notice. On the second offense such minor shall be taken into custody and released to the juvenile authorities of Greene County, Missouri, for such proceedings as may be taken in accordance with and pursuant to the juvenile laws of the State of Missouri.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen and its approval by the Mayor.
