Mayor Jamie Schoolcraft led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Jamie Schoolcraft called the meeting to order.

Roll Call

Deputy City Clerk, Kate Gould called the roll call-Aldermen Richard Simpson-present; Aldermen Joe Cosby-Present; Aldermen Louie Amodeo-present; Mayor Jamie Schoolcraft-present; Aldermen Paul C. Hood-present; Aldermen Dale Duvall-present; and Aldermen Bryan Vincent-present.

Approval of Agenda

Aldermen Amodeo stated that he would like to amend the agenda to include Mayor's Compensation as item 6e. Mayor Schoolcraft stated that he would like to amend the agenda to include pool lighting as item 6f.

Motion made by Aldermen Duvall and seconded by Aldermen Amodeo to approve the agenda with the amendments listed above. Aldermen Simpson-I; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; and Aldermen Vincent-I. All votes aye. Motion carried.

Approve the minutes of the February 23, 2009 Meeting

Motion made by Aldermen Duvall and seconded by Aldermen Vincent to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on February 23, 2009. Aldermen Simpson-I; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; and Aldermen Vincent-I. All votes aye. Motion carried.

Approve the minutes of the February 26, 2009 Meeting

Motion made by Aldermen Duvall and seconded by Aldermen Cosby to approve the minutes of the special meeting on February 26, 2009. Aldermen Simpson-Abstain; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; and Aldermen Vincent-I. Five (5) votes aye and one (1) vote to abstain. Motion carried.

Financial Report

Financial Statements: **Motion** made by Aldermen Cosby and seconded by Aldermen Duvall to approve the financial statements. Aldermen Simpson-I; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; and Aldermen Vincent-I. All votes aye. Motion carried.

Aquatics Center Payment Request: Request to pay Larkin Aquatics \$9,940.30 and Carrothers Construction \$212,976.44 for construction of the new Willard Aquatics Center.

Motion made by Aldermen Amodeo and seconded by Aldermen Duvall to approve the payments for Carrothers Construction and Larkin Aquatics. Aldermen Simpson-I; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; and Aldermen Vincent-I. All votes aye. Motion carried.

Pool Expenditures: Aldermen Simpson stated that he thought that the vote of the Park Board on the approval of the second slide had been improper because of an opinion from the Missouri Municipal League. Mayor Schoolcraft stated that he had consulted with the city attorney and believed that the vote was correct under Roberts Rule of Order.

Motion made by Aldermen Vincent and seconded by Aldermen Simpson to cancel the order of the slide. Aldermen Simpson-I; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-N; Aldermen Hood-N; Aldermen Duvall-N; Aldermen Vincent-I. Mayor Schoolcraft-N. Three (3) votes aye and four (4) votes no. Motion failed.

Group Insurance Renewal: Request to approve the renewal of the Principal Financial Group health insurance (Increase of 7% from 2008), vision insurance, and dental insurance (Increase of 4% from 2008). Karen stated that the increase over last year's rates was well below the amount that had been budget for in the 2009 budget.

Motion made by Aldermen Cosby to approve the renewal of the Principal Financial Group health insurance, vision insurance, and dental insurance. Aldermen Simpson-I; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; Aldermen Vincent-N. Five (5) votes aye and one (1) vote no. Motion carried.

Mayor's Compensation: Aldermen Amodeo stated that he believed the Mayor should receive a raise in compensation from \$200 because the city no longer had a city administrator and the Mayor had taken over most of the former duties of the city administrator.

Motion made by Aldermen Amodeo and seconded by Aldermen Duvall to increase the Mayor's monthly compensation from \$200 a month to \$500 per month until a city administrator is hired. Aldermen Simpson-N; Aldermen Cosby-N; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; Aldermen Vincent-N. Mayor Schoolcraft-Abstain. Three (3) votes aye and three (3) votes no. Motion failed.

Motion made by Aldermen Cosby and seconded by Aldermen Duvall to increase the Mayor's monthly compensation from \$200 a month to \$300 per month. Aldermen Simpson-N; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; Aldermen Vincent-N. Four (4) votes aye and two (2) votes no. Motion carried.

Pool Lighting:

Motion made by Aldermen Amodeo and seconded by Aldermen Duvall to accept the bid from SS Electric for \$20,800 for lighting for the Willard Aquatics Center. Aldermen Simpson-N; Aldermen Cosby-I; Aldermen Amodeo-I; Aldermen Hood-I; Aldermen Duvall-I; Aldermen Vincent-I. Five (5) votes aye and one (1) vote no. Motion carried.

Police Report

Chief Tom McClain reported that incident numbers were down for the last month, however the department had been busy with investigations. Chief was also working hard on Charity Boxing that is scheduled for March 14 and the department had gotten some good media coverage surrounding Charity Boxing and the PAL program.

Development Report

Randy Brown reported that a number of applications had been picked-up last week for housing and a new car wash. He stated that the work on the pool was going well and that work would begin soon on the Community Building to fix the wall that had been damaged when a truck had run into it. Also the final plans for the intersection of Jackson and Highway 160 had been submitted to MODOT. They hoped to begin the bidding process soon so that the project could be completed before the 2009-2010 school year.

Public Works Report

Charlie Jones spoke about how the new software that created work orders was working and reported that the interconnect/chlorination project was progressing as planned. He also stated that Willard had been chosen as the best tasting water in the State of Missouri by the Missouri Rural Water Association. Willard's water will be shipped to Washington, D.C. for competition at the national level.

Parks & Recreation Report

Kevin McDonald stated that they had raised about \$1,000 more for Project Playground. Also Conco Quarries, Inc. had donated \$5,000 to the parks department. Kevin reminded the Aldermen about upcoming park events like the St. Patrick's Day Dance and the Easter Egg Hunt. The parks department had also initiated an inventory system for concessions to ensure accountability. Park Board has elected new officers and they are Lucille Murray, Chair; Blaine Kennard, Vice-Chair; and Valorie Simpson, Secretary.

Ordinance-Commerce Bank Lease Agreement dated September 1, 1992

Karen stated that this ordinance was for the park land at Jackson Street Park and was part of the yearly renewal for the lease-purchase agreement.

AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND ENACTING A NEW CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WILLARD; ESTABLISHING THE SAME; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES NOT INCLUDED THEREIN, EXCEPT AS HEREIN EXPRESSLY PROVIDED; PROVIDING FOR THE MANNER OF AMENDING SUCH CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Willard as follows:

Section 1: That pursuant to Section 71.943 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, the codification of ordinances, as set out in Titles I through VII, each inclusive, of the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Willard" is hereby adopted and enacted as the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Willard"; which shall supersede all other general and permanent ordinances of the City passed on or before December 22, 2008, to the extent provided in Section 3 hereof.

Section 2: That all provisions of such Code shall be in full force and effect from and after the effective date of this ordinance as set forth herein. Statutory changes made and included herein shall be set out in Exhibit A. (see attached)

Section 3: That all ordinances of a general and permanent nature of the City adopted on final passage on or before December 22, 2008, and not included in such Code or recognized and continued in force by reference therein, are hereby repealed from and after the effective date of this ordinance, except those which may be specifically excepted by separate ordinance, and except the following which are hereby continued in full force and effect, unless specifically repealed by separate ordinance:

- a. Ordinances promising or guaranteeing the payment of money for the City, or authorizing the issuance of any bonds or notes of the City or any other evidence of the City's indebtedness, or authorizing any contract or obligation assumed by the City;
- b. Ordinances levying taxes or making special assessments;
- c. Ordinances appropriating funds or establishing salaries and compensation, and providing for expenses;
- d. Ordinances granting franchises or rights to any person, firm or corporation;
- e. Ordinances relating to the dedication, opening, closing, naming, establishment of grades, improvement, altering, paving, widening or vacating of streets, alleys, sidewalks or public places;
- f. Ordinances authorizing or relating to particular public improvements;

- g. Ordinances respecting the conveyances or acceptance of real property or easements in real property;
- h. Ordinances dedicating, accepting or vacating any plat or subdivision in the City or any part thereof, or providing regulations for the same;
- i. Ordinances annexing property to the City;
- j. All zoning and subdivision ordinances not specifically repealed and not included herein;
- k. Ordinances establishing TIF districts or redevelopment districts;
- l. Ordinances relating to traffic schedules (i.e. stop signs, parking limits, etc.);
- m. All ordinances relating to personnel regulations (i.e. pensions, retirement, job descriptions and insurance, etc.);
- n. Ordinances authorizing the establishment of industrial development corporations;
- o. Ordinances establishing tax rates for the City.

That the repeal provided for in this Section shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or part thereof that has been repealed by a subsequent ordinance which is repealed by this ordinance.

That the repeal provided for in this Section shall not affect any offense or act committed or done or any penalty or forfeiture incurred or any contract or right established or accruing before the effective date of this ordinance, nor shall it affect any prosecution, suit or proceeding pending or any judgment rendered prior to such date.

Section 4: That any and all additions and amendments to such Code when passed in such form as to indicate the intention of the Board of Aldermen to make the same a part thereof shall be deemed to be incorporated in such Code so that reference to the "Code of Ordinances of the City of Willard" shall be understood and intended to include such additions and amendments.

Section 5:

- a. Except as hereinafter provided, whenever in any rule, regulation or order promulgated pursuant to such ordinances of the City, any act is prohibited or is made or declared to be unlawful or an offense or a misdemeanor, or whenever in such City ordinance, rule, regulation or order doing of any act is required or the failure to do any act is declared to be unlawful, where no specific penalty is provided therefore, the violation

of any such ordinance of the City, or of any rule, regulation or order promulgated pursuant to such City ordinance, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) and not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

- b. Whenever any provision of the Revised Statutes of Missouri or other Statute of the State limits the authority of the City to punish the violation of any particular provision of these ordinances or rules, regulations or orders promulgated pursuant thereto to a fine of less amount than that provided in this Section or imprisonment for a shorter term than that provided in this Section, be punished by the imposition of not more than the maximum fine or imprisonment so authorized, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- c. Whenever any provision of the Revised Statutes of Missouri or other Statute of the State establishes a penalty differing from that provided by this Section for an offense similar to any offense established by these ordinances, rules, regulations or other orders of the City, the violation of such City law, ordinance, rule, regulation or order shall be punished by the fine or imprisonment established for such similar offense by such State law.
- d. Each day any violation of these ordinances, rules, regulations or orders promulgated pursuant thereto shall continue shall constitute a separate offense, unless otherwise provided.
- e. Whenever any act is prohibited by this Code, by an amendment thereof, or by any rule or regulation adopted thereunder, such prohibition shall extend to and include the causing, securing, aiding or abetting of another person to do said act. Whenever any act is prohibited by this Code, an attempt to do the act is likewise prohibited.

Section 6: that in case of the amendment by the Board of Aldermen of any Section of Such Code for which a penalty is not provided, the general penalty as provided in Section 5 of this ordinance shall apply to the Section as amended; or in case such amendment contains provisions for which a penalty other than the aforementioned general penalty is provided in another Section in the same Chapter, the penalty so provided in such other Section shall be held to relate to the Section so amended, unless such penalty is specifically repealed therein.

Section 7: That a copy of such Code shall be kept on file in the office of the City Clerk, preserved in looseleaf form or in such other form as the City Clerk may consider most expedient. It shall be the express duty of the City Clerk, or someone authorized by said officer, to insert in their designated places all amendments and all ordinances or resolutions which indicate the intention of the Board of Aldermen to make the same part of such Code when the same have been printed or reprinted in page form and to extract from such Code all provisions which from time to time may be repealed by the Board of Aldermen. This copy of such Code shall be available for all persons desiring to examine the same.

Section 8: That it shall be unlawful for any person to change or alter by additions or deletions any part or portion of such Code, or to insert or delete pages or portions thereof, or to alter or tamper with such Code in any manner whatsoever which will cause the law of the City of Willard to be misrepresented thereby. Any person violating this Section shall be punished as provided in Section 5 of this ordinance.

Section 9: It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Board of Aldermen that the Sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance and the Code hereby adopted are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or Section of this ordinance or the Code hereby adopted shall be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and Sections of this ordinance or the Code hereby adopted.

Section 10: This ordinance and the Code adopted hereby shall become effective April 13th, 2009.

TITLE II. PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE
CHAPTER 210: OFFENSES
ARTICLE I. GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 210.005: DEFINITIONS

DANGEROUS FELONY: The felonies of arson in the first degree, assault in the first degree, attempted forcible rape if physical injury results, attempted forcible sodomy if physical injury results, forcible rape, forcible sodomy, kidnapping, murder in the second degree, assault of a Law Enforcement Officer in the first degree, domestic assault in the first degree, elder abuse in the first degree, robbery in the first degree, statutory rape in the first degree when the victim is a child less than twelve (12) years of age at the time of the commission of the act giving rise to the offense, statutory sodomy in the first degree when the victim is a child less than twelve (12) years of age at the time of the commission of the act giving rise to the offense, and abuse of a child pursuant to Subdivision (2) of Subsection (3) of Section 568.060, RSMo., and child kidnapping.

CHAPTER 210: OFFENSES
ARTICLE II. OFFENSES AGAINST THE PERSON

SECTION 210.030: HARASSMENT

A person commits the offense of harassment if for the purpose of frightening or disturbing another person he/she:

- .1. Communicates in writing or by telephone a threat to commit any felony;
- .2. Makes a telephone call or communicates in writing and uses coarse language offensive to one of average sensibility;
- .3. Makes a telephone call anonymously; or
- .4. Makes repeated telephone calls.

CHANGE TO:

SECTION 210.030: HARASSMENT

A person commits the offense of harassment if **he or she**:

- .1. Knowingly communicates a threat to commit any felony to another person and in so doing frightens, intimidates, or causes emotional distress to such other person; or**
- .2. When communicating with another person, knowingly uses coarse language offensive to one of average sensibility and thereby puts such person in reasonable apprehension of offensive physical contact or harm; or**
- .3. Knowingly frightens, intimidates, or causes emotional distress to another person by anonymously making a telephone call or any electronic communication; or**
- .4. Knowingly communicates with another person who is, or who purports to be, seventeen years of age or younger and in so doing and without good cause recklessly frightens, intimidates, or causes emotional distress to such other person; or**
- .5. Knowingly makes repeated unwanted communication to another person; or**
- .6. Without good cause engages in any other act with the purpose to frighten, intimidate, or cause emotional distress to another person, cause such person to be frightened, intimidated, or emotionally distressed, and such person's response to the act is one of a person of average sensibilities considering the age of such person.**

CHAPTER 210: OFFENSES
ARTICLE XI. Sexual Offenses

SECTION 210.485: CERTAIN OFFENDERS NOT TO BE PRESENT WITHIN FIVE HUNDRED FEET OF SCHOOL PROPERTY, EXCEPTION— PERMISSION REQUIRED FOR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS WHO ARE OFFENDERS, PROCEDURE

- A. Any person who has pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to, or been convicted of, or been found guilty of violating any of the provisions of Chapter 566, RSMo., or the provisions of Subsection (2) of Section 568.020, RSMo., Incest; Section 568.045, RSMo., Endangering The Welfare Of A Child In The 1st Degree; Subsection (2) of Section 568.080; RSMo., Use Of A Child In A Sexual Performance; Section 568.090, RSMo., Promoting A Sexual Performance By A Child; Section 573.023, RSMo., Sexual Exploitation Of A Minor; Section 573.025, RSMo., Promoting Child Pornography; or Section 573.040, RSMo., Furnishing Pornographic Material To Minors shall not be present in or loiter within five hundred (500) feet of any school building, on real property comprising any school, or in any conveyance owned, leased or contracted by a school to transport students to or from school or a school-related activity when persons under the age of eighteen (18) are present in the building, on the grounds or in the conveyance, unless the offender is a parent, legal guardian or custodian of a student present in the building and has met the conditions set forth in Subsection (B) of this Section.
